MEETING OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS MINUTES December 9, 2016

The undersigned, being the duly appointed Secretary of the Houston Forensic Science Center, Inc., (the "Corporation"), hereby certifies that the following are true and correct minutes of the December 9, 2016 meeting of the Board of Directors (the "Board"), of the Corporation.

- A. In a manner permitted by the Corporation's Bylaws, the meeting was called by providing all Directors with notice of the date, time, place, and purposes of the meeting more than three days before the date of the meeting.
- B. In accordance with Chapter 551, Texas Government Code, which Chapter is made applicable to the Corporation by Section 431.004, Texas Transportation Code, a notice of the meeting was duly filed on December 6, 2016, in the same manner and location as required by law of the City of Houston, Texas (the "City").
- C. The meeting was called to order by Nicole B. Cásarez, Chairwoman of the Board, at approximately 9:00 a.m. on Friday, December 9, 2016, in the Council Annex Chambers, 900 Bagby St. (Public Level), Houston, Texas 77002.
- D. Ashley Chapman called the roll. The following Directors were present: Nicole B. Cásarez, Janet Blancett, Dr. Robert "Bob" H. McPherson, Dr. Stacey A. Mitchell, and Sandra Guerra Thompson.

The following Directors were absent: Anthony Graves, David M. Feldman, and Tom P. Allen (ex-officio).

Chairwoman Cásarez announced that a quorum of the Directors was present.

- E. Chairwoman Cásarez noted that a draft of the minutes of the Corporation's meeting on October 14, 2016 had been distributed to the board. Dr. Mitchell made a motion to approve the minutes of the October 14, 2016 meeting, and the motion was seconded by Ms. Blancett. The motion passed unanimously, and the minutes of the October 14, 2016 meeting were adopted.
- F. Chairwoman Cásarez asked if any members of the public wished to address the board. She noted that no one asked to address the board and the meeting continued.
- G. Mr. Feldman joined the meeting at approximately 9:05 a.m.
- H. Chairwoman Cásarez provided a Chair's report. She noted that Mr. Graves was absent because he was attending a lunch in his honor by the Texas Fair Representation Project in Austin. Chairwoman Cásarez introduced Ms. Renee Byas, HFSC's new General Counsel. Chairwoman Cásarez thanked Mr. Tom Allen, HFSC's former general

counsel and current ex-officio board member, and Mr. Ron Sandberg, former attorney for the HFSC, for their dedication and hard work. Chairwoman Cásarez thanked Dr. Mitchell for participating in a meeting with State Representative Carol Alvarado. She reported that Council Member Steve Le and Council Member Amanda Edwards will tour the Center in January 2017. Chairwoman Cásarez noted that the November 2016 board meeting was cancelled because the City of Houston (COH) was unavailable to present the findings of the Forensic Science Task Force report. She noted that since November, HFSC has been working with the Office of the Mayor on funding options, and met with COH representatives, including City Finance, to discuss the performance audit portion of the Forensic Science Task Force report. At that meeting, the COH indicated that it wants HFSC's next budget request to be based on a fee-for-service model. She asked that Dr. McPherson and Dr. Mitchell serve on a budget working group to collaborate with the HFSC business development group. She asked that Vice Chairwoman Thompson and Mr. Graves serve on a fundraising working group. Chairwoman Cásarez noted that, given the HFSC's budget situation, certain board members made donations to the HFSC to subsidize the cost of the HFSC holiday party.

- I. Mr. Jay Guerrero, Regional Director of Southeast Texas for U.S. Senator John Cornyn, provided an overview of the Justice for All Reauthorization Act, which was sponsored by Senator Cornyn. Chairwoman Cásarez thanked Mr. Guerrero and Senator Cornyn for working on this important legislation and extended an invitation to visit the HFSC, Vice Chairwoman Thompson provided suggestions for future initiatives, and Dr. Mitchell expressed her gratitude and the impact the work makes in her job as a sexual assault nurse examiner.
- J. Chairwoman Cásarez noted that the audio was not functioning properly at the beginning of the meeting and stated that a quorum is present for the December 9th board meeting and the October 14, 2016 minutes were unanimously approved.
- K. Dr. Daniel D. Garner, President and Chief Executive Officer (CSO), provided a President's report. He reported that HFSC currently employs 195 staff members, but noted that 6 staff members may be leaving the Center in the near future. Ms. Caresse Young, Director of Human Resources, provided information on recruiting, the competitive pay scale and benefits at HFSC, and the impact of budget uncertainties on the workforce. Dr. Garner reported that over 1,700 training hours were logged this month, including laboratory information management system (LIMS) training, Lean Six Sigma training, and integrated crime scene unit training. He reported that he received an inquiry from the Washington D.C. forensic laboratory about HFSC's blind testing program. He reported that the Center implemented a new visitor management system. Dr. Garner noted that meetings are being scheduled with the new Chief of Police and District Attorney in the new year. Chairwoman Cásarez asked about the recent cancellation of the drone demonstration event. Dr. Garner explained that the drone demonstration event was cancelled after Houston Police Department's (HPD) legal department asked him to postpone the event. Dr. Garner was informed that this demonstration should not be conducted at the HPD Memorial and that HPD officers should not be involved. Dr. Garner explained that the Center will still be able to use the drone at crime scenes but another staff member will need to obtain certification to

- operate the drone. Chairwoman Cásarez asked about the status of the report from the Office of Inspector General (OIG) regarding HFSC's CSU director. Dr. Garner informed the board that the OIG found no evidence to support any of the charges against the CSU director. There was further discussion about HFSC's new policy concerning review of press releases by HPD, or other stakeholders, for sensitivities. The board requested a copy of the policy for further review.
- L. Dr. Peter Stout, Vice President and Chief Operations Officer, provided a Vice President's Report. He reviewed the operations report for December 2016. He compared the total average turnaround time (TAT), requests received, and total average process time from calendar year 2015 to 2016. Dr. Stout reviewed the average total TAT, backlogged requests, average process TAT, and wait gap since the start of the HFSC. He reviewed the monthly average of requests received and noted that in November the lab achieved an average TAT of 43 days. Dr. Stout reviewed the major initiatives, including the progress on the implementation of the new LIMS, the forensic biology Lean Six Sigma project, and the blind quality control (BQC) program. He provided an update on the activities and casework of all HFSC sections.
- M. Mr. David Leach, Treasurer and Chief Financial Officer, presented a proposal for reallocation for FY'17 budget funds. Mr. Feldman made a motion to approve the proposed reallocation for FY'17 budget funds, and Dr. McPherson seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
- N. Mr. Leach provided a Treasurer's report. He reviewed the FY'17 budget versus FY'17 actual noting costs for personnel, supplies, and services. Mr. Leach reviewed the spending details for the period of July 1, 2016 through November 30, 2016, the year-to-date (YTD) versus budget, and the full year budget amount and percentage spent YTD. Mr. Leach provided a report on the Center's grants as of November 2016.
- O. Ms. Lori Wilson, Quality Director, provided a Quality Division Update for October and November 2016. Ms. Wilson reviewed the testimony monitoring, proficiency testing activity, and the BQC program activity. She reviewed incidents and corrective actions, including a corrective action that was disclosed to the Texas Forensic Science Commission. Ms. Wilson noted that the final report would be provided once complete. She reported that the quality division conducted an internal audit of the latent print section based on a complaint received through HFSC's internal anonymous site. Ms. Wilson reported that 10 additional analysts completed certification and the manager of toxicology is now American Board of Forensic Toxicology certified. Ms. Wilson reported that 70 individuals at HFSC are certified and at least one person in every discipline is certified.
- P. Pursuant to Section 551.074(a)(1) of the Texas Government Code, the Board went into Executive Session at approximately 11:37 a.m. for discussion of personnel matters. Ms. Renee Byas, HFSC's General Counsel, was also present during the Executive Session, and Dr. Daniel Garner, President and CEO, joined the Executive Session in part.

- Q. The Executive Session concluded at approximately 12:49 p.m. The open meeting reconvened at 12:49 p.m. No action was taken following the Executive Session.
- R. Dr. McPherson made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Ms. Blancett seconded the motion. There being no other business, the meeting was ADJOURNED at 12:49 p.m.
